Homelessness in Bass

There are 112 people without a home in Bass.

Homelessness affects **23 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Bass **79th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in Bass

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **22 young people** without a home in Bass – that's **29 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
