Homelessness in **Brighton**

There are 172 people without a home in Brighton.

Homelessness affects **27 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Brighton **57th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in Brighton

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **14 young people** without a home in Brighton – that's **14 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
