

Homelessness in Broadmeadows

There are **553 people** without a home in Broadmeadows.

Homelessness affects **71 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Broadmeadows **9th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in Broadmeadows

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **180 young people** without a home in Broadmeadows – that's **135 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
