

Homelessness in Brunswick

There are **425 people** without a home in Brunswick.

Homelessness affects **62 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Brunswick **16th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in Brunswick

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **118 young people** without a home in Brunswick – that's **99 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
