

Homelessness in Caulfield

There are **443 people** without a home in Caulfield.

Homelessness affects **64 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Caulfield **13th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in Caulfield

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **81 young people** without a home in Caulfield – that's **76 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
