

Homelessness in Croydon

There are **202 people** without a home in Croydon.

Homelessness affects **29 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Croydon **45th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in Croydon

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **42 young people** without a home in Croydon – that's **38 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
