Homelessness in Footscray

There are 613 people without a home in Footscray.

Homelessness affects **86 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Footscray **7th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in Footscray

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **162 young people** without a home in Footscray – that's **143 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
