

# Homelessness in Richmond

There are **699 people** without a home in Richmond.

Homelessness affects **107 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Richmond **3rd in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

## Young people and homelessness in Richmond

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **109 young people** without a home in Richmond – that's **131 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
