Homelessness in South-West Coast

There are 215 people without a home in South-West Coast.

Homelessness affects **33 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking South-West Coast **41st in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in South-West Coast

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **37 young people** without a home in South-West Coast – that's **35 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
