Homelessness in St Albans

There are 673 people without a home in St Albans.

Homelessness affects **91 people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking St Albans **4th in Victoria** out of 88 electorates.

Young people and homelessness in St Albans

Young people without homes have different needs than adults. If they can't safely return home, they are likely to need support to maximise their potential, as well as a home they can afford on a very low income.

There are **202 young people** without a home in St Albans – that's **158 young people** per 10,000, compared to the Victorian average of 64 per 10,000.
