

Homelessness in Albert Park

There are **613 people** without a home in Albert Park on any given night.

Homelessness affects **83 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Albert Park **13th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 7.7% in Albert Park.

In 2016, there were 664 people without a home, ranking Albert Park 5th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
