

Homelessness in Bass

There are **113 people** without a home in Bass on any given night.

Homelessness affects **17 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Bass **82nd out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has increased by 0.4% in Bass.

In 2016, there were 112 people without a home, ranking Bass 79th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
