## Homelessness in Brighton

There are 153 people without a home in Brighton on any given night.

Homelessness affects **24 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Brighton **70th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

## **Tracking progress**

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 10.9% in Brighton.

In 2016, there were 172 people without a home, ranking Brighton 57th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
