

Homelessness in Caulfield

There are **508 people** without a home in Caulfield on any given night.

Homelessness affects **73 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Caulfield **17th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has increased by 14.6% in Caulfield.

In 2016, there were 443 people without a home, ranking Caulfield 13th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
