Homelessness in Cranbourne

There are 506 people without a home in Cranbourne on any given night.

Homelessness affects 58 people per 10,000 compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Cranbourne 18th out of 88 Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has increased by 111.1% in Cranbourne.

In 2016, there were 240 people without a home, ranking Cranbourne 38th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
