

Homelessness in Eildon

There are **168 people** without a home in Eildon on any given night.

Homelessness affects **25 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Eildon **67th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 1.2% in Eildon.

In 2016, there were 170 people without a home, ranking Eildon 59th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
