Homelessness in Essendon

There are 286 people without a home in Essendon on any given night.

Homelessness affects 41 people per 10,000 compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Essendon 44th out of 88 Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 15.6% in Essendon.

In 2016, there were 339 people without a home, ranking Essendon 24th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
