Homelessness in Eureka

There are 355 people without a home in Eureka on any given night.

Homelessness affects 47 people per 10,000 compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Eureka 33rd out of 88 Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has increased by 113.8% in Eureka.

In 2016, there were 166 people without a home, ranking Eureka 60th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
