Homelessness in Kew

There are 126 people without a home in Kew on any given night.

Homelessness affects 17 people per 10,000 compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Kew 77th out of 88 Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 26.6% in Kew.

In 2016, there were 172 people without a home, ranking Kew 56th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
