

Homelessness in Malvern

There are **283 people** without a home in Malvern on any given night.

Homelessness affects **45 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Malvern **45th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has increased by 3.6% in Malvern.

In 2016, there were 273 people without a home, ranking Malvern 33rd out of 88 Victorian electorates.
