Homelessness in Melbourne

There are 1084 people without a home in Melbourne on any given night.

Homelessness affects 88 people per 10,000 compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Melbourne 3rd out of 88 Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 28.1% in Melbourne.

In 2016, there were 1508 people without a home, ranking Melbourne 1st out of 88 Victorian electorates.
