Homelessness in Mildura

There are 516 people without a home in Mildura on any given night.

Homelessness affects **74 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Mildura **16th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has increased by 95.4% in Mildura.

In 2016, there were 264 people without a home, ranking Mildura 35th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
