

Homelessness in Point Cook

There are **175 people** without a home in Point Cook on any given night.

Homelessness affects **19 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Point Cook **65th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has increased by 0.1% in Point Cook.

In 2016, there were 175 people without a home, ranking Point Cook 55th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
