## Homelessness in Richmond

There are 496 people without a home in Richmond on any given night.

Homelessness affects **74 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Richmond **19th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

## **Tracking progress**

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 29.1% in Richmond.

In 2016, there were 699 people without a home, ranking Richmond 3rd out of 88 Victorian electorates.
