

Homelessness in Sandringham

There are **80 people** without a home in Sandringham on any given night.

Homelessness affects **14 people per 10,000** compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking Sandringham **86th out of 88** Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 15.0% in Sandringham.

In 2016, there were 94 people without a home, ranking Sandringham 84th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
