Homelessness in St Albans

There are 622 people without a home in St Albans on any given night.

Homelessness affects 83 people per 10,000 compared to the state average of 42 per 10,000 – ranking St Albans 11th out of 88 Victorian electorates.

Tracking progress

In March 2023, the ABS released its Estimating Homelessness report from the 2021 Census, allowing us to compare how homelessness has changed since 2016.

Since the last Census, homelessness has decreased by 7.5% in St Albans.

In 2016, there were 673 people without a home, ranking St Albans 4th out of 88 Victorian electorates.
